



**Rent Well is offering a new tenant education program delivered by certified instructors in Clackamas, Multnomah and Washington Counties.**

Rent Well is a 15-hour class, typically delivered over 6 weeks, and covers key information for being a responsible and stable tenant. Participants explore any screening barriers they may have, take steps to address those barriers, and prepare to be successful tenants in the future.

**During this class, participants learn to:**

- Pre-screen themselves
- Create a personalized plan for stable housing
- Plan a workable household budget that makes paying rent a priority
- Review rental agreements to understand common terms and expectations
- Understand the landlord's perspective
- Move-in and move-out the right way
- Maintain a clean, safe and healthy home

Rent Well graduation requirements include full attendance of 15 hours of class, completion of assignments and the development of a housing portfolio that will show landlords a participant's qualifications as a tenant. Upon graduation, students receive a Graduation Certificate verifying successful completion of the program.

**\*TEMPORARILY UNAVAILABLE\* Landlords are eligible to register for the Rent Well Landlord Guarantee which allows landlords to recoup up to 1 month rent (max. \$1000.) to cover damages, unpaid rent, or eviction costs if a Rent Well grad tenant is evicted. (This applies to Washington County participants; the guarantee varies by county.)**

## **The Rent Well Landlord Guarantee is an incentive for landlords to rent to Rent Well graduates.**

If a landlord registers\* when renting a unit to a Rent Well graduate, and that tenant vacates the unit within twelve months from the move-in date noted on the Rental Agreement and leaves unpaid rent or damages, the Guarantee may reimburse for:

- Damages in excess of normal wear and tear that exceed the security deposit
- Eviction-related court costs;
- Up to one month's non-payment of rent

The Landlord Guarantee is available for units in Oregon only. Landlord Guarantee registration procedures and policies vary by county; contact the Lead Agency in the county where your prospective tenant took the course for more information. Landlords should screen a Rent Well graduate as they would any other potential tenant.

*\*Access to the Landlord Guarantee is based on available funds. Landlords are strongly urged to contact the Lead Agency to confirm that a Rent Well graduate's certificate is valid and that guarantee funds are available before signing a rental agreement with the tenant.*

**Landlord Guarantee coverage varies by County where the graduate completed Rent Well:**

- **Multnomah County: up to \$2,000**
- **Clackamas and Washington Counties: up to \$1,000 or one month's rent, whichever is less**
